
# The Halifax Academy Careers Programme Phases 1-5

# Phase 3 Year 5 & 6 – 'What do I want to be when I grow up'

Use awareness of the local area and 'people who help us' to explore the jobs around us.





**Year 7-** Sowing the seeds to the possibilities of what their future could look like.

- Difference between work and school.
- Understand what skills and attributes are need at work.
- Complete interests and Personality quizzes to identify personality type, skills and qualifications and potential careers.
- Students set up their own profile on Unifrog and use the careers platform to explore career options and competencies.
